ACADEMIC TIMETABEL

Classes are offered at a variety of different times:

Tuesdays and Thursdays in 1.5 hour sessions

One day a week (can be any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday) in a 3 hour session

ALLOWED STAY TERM

FROM [Mid-August (to be determined)/ 2023] TO [Mid-May (to be determined) / 2024]

*This is at the discretion of the LHU Housing Office and students receive information upon arrival. Students are permitted to stay for short breaks, for example, Thanksgiving Break and Spring Break, however, we encourage travel as there is no dining/food service. This is currently offered at no extra cost, but is subject to change.

Yes, the Housing Office has quarantine housing for students who test positive and need separate housing. We also have a meal delivery program.
